WHY DID GOD CHOOSE MARY? (LUKE 1&2)

She was a virgin, a young woman probably around 15-17 years of age and was betrothed to be married to Joseph.

The angel, Gabriel, said she was highly favored by God and the Lord was with her. Mary was greatly troubled, even afraid at the angel's greeting. He told her not to be troubled, she had found favor with God. Why? Gabriel then announced that she would bear the Messiah, Jesus, whose "kingdom will never end." She questioned, how could that happen? By the power of the Holy Spirit. Mary's response: "I am the Lord's servant. May your

word to me be fulfilled."

Her song in vs 46-55 reveals just how mature, godly and humble Mary's attitude and heart were.

She recognized the incredible honor it was to be chosen to bring the Messiah into the world and yet she acknowledged the mercy of God in choosing a humble human instrument such as her for the privilege. Later she delivered her child in a dirty stable in a town away from her family, fled to Egypt to save Jesus's life from Herod, and she frantically searched for Jesus at the Temple when He was teaching the religious leaders at the age of 10. She witnessed His miracles. After all that, she experienced the grief and pain of watching that precious son of hers be chased by the religious rulers of the day and nailed to a cross to die a gruesome, torturous criminal's death.

How often did Mary question the wisdom of God—as I would?

My conclusion: Mary was not chosen by God randomly. She was highly favored by God because of her humility and sensitivity to spiritual realities and God Himself. She was a strong woman with determination to carry out God's plan for her and her Son. She did not have full understanding of what God's will would look like, but she followed Jesus to the cross and beyond.

May we be people of character and determination to please God as Mary was, whatever our age and circumstance.
